Hospital Acquired Infection Reduction Practices Related to CAUTI and CLABSI

This multi-session event will target providers, nursing, quality leaders, and infection prevention staff with virtual education events followed by an onsite opportunity for hospitals to meet Kathleen and complete hands-on training at one of three onsite hospital visits. Target Audience: Providers, Nursing, Quality Leaders, Infection Prevention Staff

Overview: Clinical Nurse Specialist, Kathleen Vollman, will provide education to providers, nurses, quality leaders, infection preventionists and other health care leaders regarding best practices for eliminating and preventing hospital acquired infections related to catheter utilization, central line use, and infection prevention. We are requesting participating hospitals to have their medical staff participate in the 20-minute virtual event, where Kathleen will present the top provider take homes that will drive change.

Onsite Visits: Limited spaces are available. Registered facilities are encouraged to bring 2 team members to their nearest regional site to receive continued comprehensive education, complete a tour of multiple units to discuss opportunities for improvement with frontline staff and take notes to bring back to their team to implement and adopt new process improvement strategies. **These onsite visits will be capped at a maximum of 16 participants or 8 individual organizations.**

Objectives:

At the conclusion of this activity, participants should be better able to:

- Discuss national trends in CLABSI/CAUTI rates and utilization since the pandemic
- Reflect and identify what we have learned through the pandemic that can be used to reboot CLABSI/CAUTI initiatives
- Implement a mechanism to analyze and reduce the risks
- Analyze clinical indications for the appropriate and inappropriate indications for catheter placement as well as alternatives to indwelling urinary catheter use, central line placement/use/access, as well as alternatives to central lines
- Understand strategies for encouraging removal of catheters i.e. nurse-driven protocols
- Identify and detail the evidence-based practices that go beyond the guidelines in preventing CAUTI's
- Identify strategies to reduce inappropriate cultures
- Identify which practices of maintenance bundles were retained during the pandemic and interventions that need a reboot
- Discuss the maintenance bundle challenges and evidence-based strategies to overcome them
- Create a strategy to address both culture and clinical practices related to central line use
